

Why Whiteness Means Capitalism

Capitalism is defined as private property ownership

Examples of private property include the following: Home/land, a building you rent as a landlord, a business, people (kids or slaves), your individual liberties.

Police are considered to be the managers of private property.

Private property ownership creates all problems in society: Racism, patriarchy, transphobia, climate change, mental health problems, crime, etc.

If capitalism (private property ownership) is abolished, all problems in society will be solved.

Whiteness was created when white people brought black slaves to the United States as private property.

Prior to this, people referred to themselves by their ethnicity: English, Irish, French, Spanish, etc.

When they arrived in the United States with slaves, they began referring to themselves as white to differentiate themselves as the owners of the power structure, and black people as the private property that they owned

Whiteness is a reference to the private property owner that are benefiting from capitalism.

White privilege means a beneficiary of capitalism, or a beneficiary of private property ownership.

Blackness is a reference to the oppressed worker/private property.

Capitalism is the system they are oppressed under.

The result of capitalism creating whiteness was systemic racism.

Systemic racism are racial disparities in outcomes

Private property owners (people who own houses, businesses, land, are in stable nuclear families, etc...) generally have better economic outcomes than people who do not own those things.

Another word for disparities is inequity.

Racial disparities are inequitable, because it means that some people have access to more resources (private property) than others..

The only way to solve systemic racism is to abolish capitalism, by abolishing private property ownership.

Capitalism (private property ownership) created slavery, which created systemic racism, which created inequities in society.

Abolishing capitalism (private property ownership) would eliminate the inequities by granting everyone access to the same resources, which would now be owned by the collective instead of by individuals.
